9. Prepare for the **TEXES (Texas Exam for Educator Standards) COMPETENCIES (SEE ATTACHMENT)**

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Regular class attendance is expected. More than two (2) absences will result in being dropped from the course, or the lowering of the final grade. If a true emergency arises, please contact me and bring your attending physician's note explaining the illness (this does not excuse a student from handing in late work). Daily attendance will be taken. **Class starts on time.** Being tardy disrupts the flow of class. Two tardies/early departures equal one absence.
