#### Course Description:

This course examines the great periods of Spanish art with its characteristic aesthetics, great masters, and principal architectural, sculptural, and pictorial works. The course begins with the rock art of the Paleolithic period and ends with two of the great painters of the twentieth century, Picasso and Dalí. Special attention will be given to Moorish art as well as the Romanesque, Gothic, and Baroque periods.

The research paper will be due on the date indicated on the course calendar. Late papers will receive a lateness penalty commensurate with the degree of lateness. All submissions will be made electronically using the "Assignments" function of the Blackboard web site.
