Course Objectives:

The objective of this course is to cover the sweeping millennium of time commonly referred to as the Middle Ages, or Medieval Europe; roughly from 400 A.C.E. through 1400.

Since these are book reviews, a bibliography page is not required, but just note the page reference.
2. You must write a ten-page research paper on a topic that covers something, someone, or an event during the Middle Ages. The topic must be approved by me.
3. You must maintain regular email contact with me. I have found that the problem with online classes is lack of student communication with their professor. I check and reply to email quite regularly, but if I do not hear from you for ten days??? What am I supposed to think???
