ED 5325 Advanced Educational Remediation-Summer II 2018

Course Description:

An advanced study of ways to design and implement instructional intervention for the remediation, compensation, or adjustment to the exceptional learner's deficiency.

Attendance Policy: Students are expected to attend all scheduled on-campus classes. Prompt arrival for class is expected. The instructor will monitor the Blackboard log-ins for attendance points. SRSU Class Attendance policy states “The instructors may, at their discretion, drop a student from a course when the student has a total of nine absences.” SRSU policy states “An absence is defined as non-attendance in fifty minutes of class; for example, non-attendance in a one and one-half hour class will constitute one and one-half absences and non-attendance in a three hour class will constitute three absences.” Therefore, non-attendance for Weekend Format classes calculates to: Saturday (7 hrs of class time) = 8.4 absences and Sunday (4 hrs of class time) = 4.8 absences. Make up work is at the discretion of the instructor as it relates to “explained or excused” absences. The Absences/Class Attendance policy includes all absences excused or unexcused. In this course you are expected to attend all classes, to be punctual, and to complete all assignments on time.
