Plagiarism consists of presenting the work of another as one's own (i.e., without proper acknowledgment of the source) and submitting examinations or other work in whole or in part as one's own when such work has been prepared by another person or copied from another person (see the Student Handbook).

General APA Guidelines

Your paper should have 3 parts: the cover sheet, the paper, and the Reference page.

- The title page information format is to be in the center of the entire page.
- The first line needs the assignment chapter number and name.
- On the second line is your name.
- The third line is the course number and course name.

Your essay should have lines that are double-spaced (not triple or quadruple line space) on standard-sized paper (8.5" x 11"), with 1" margins on all sides.

You use 12 pt. Times New Roman font.

- The first page header should look like the following minus the quotes "**running head: TITLE OF YOUR PAPER**" the running header should be flush left and the page number flush right. The **running head** is a shortened version of your paper's title and cannot exceed 50 characters including spacing and punctuation.
- To create the rest of the headers including the reference page: The header format is Flush left and states the name of the paper" **PAPER TITLE**" and the page numbers flush **right**.

APA format is the style all papers will be written. **Do not** do the following:

Do NOT make up the format of the paper

Do not use MLA
