Course Description: This course offers an in-depth analysis of several Spanish poets. We will explore formal, rhetorical, linguistic and ontological questions as guiding principles of the poems.

Course Objectives:

1. Understand the singularity of each poet.
2. Recognize specific traits of an author.
3. Provide opportunities for brief written or oral literary comments.
4. Compile a personal poetic anthology.

Student learning Outcomes:

SLO 1. The students will identify ontological concepts within a poem.

SLO 2. Students will recognize the importance form in written poetical pieces.

SLO 3. Students will differentiate authors according to their particular traits.

Language requirements: This course will be delivered entirely in Spanish and all assignments and readings are to be done in Spanish without the use of any automatic/electronic translator.

- Do research and present your investigation and findings in a final paper. (Rubrics will be provided)

Reading: This course is worth 3 credits, therefore, you are expected to read in Spanish at least 4 hours per week in addition to written and verbal assignments.
