REPORT – Hypotheses Testing, Multiple Regression, Time Series Analysis and Chi-Square

The Research Paper (at least 6 pages) is to be written on a 12 font, using Times New Roman, double spaced, with a one inch margin, and follow APA format. All reports require a cover page, abstract, and references page and do NOT count toward the page requirement.

Three references are required. Your textbook does not count as a reference. Please do NOT use Wikipedia or Investopedia as a reference.

All research papers are to be submitted by BlackBoard and will be submitted to Safe Assign

The required format follows:

Explain hypothesis testing, type I and type II errors, and one-tailed and two-tailed test (2 pages required).

Explain when a multiple regression model is needed, what is an adjusted R2, what is multicollinearity tests (2 pages required).

Explain when a time series analysis is required; and what is a Chi-Square Test for Independence tests (2 pages required).
