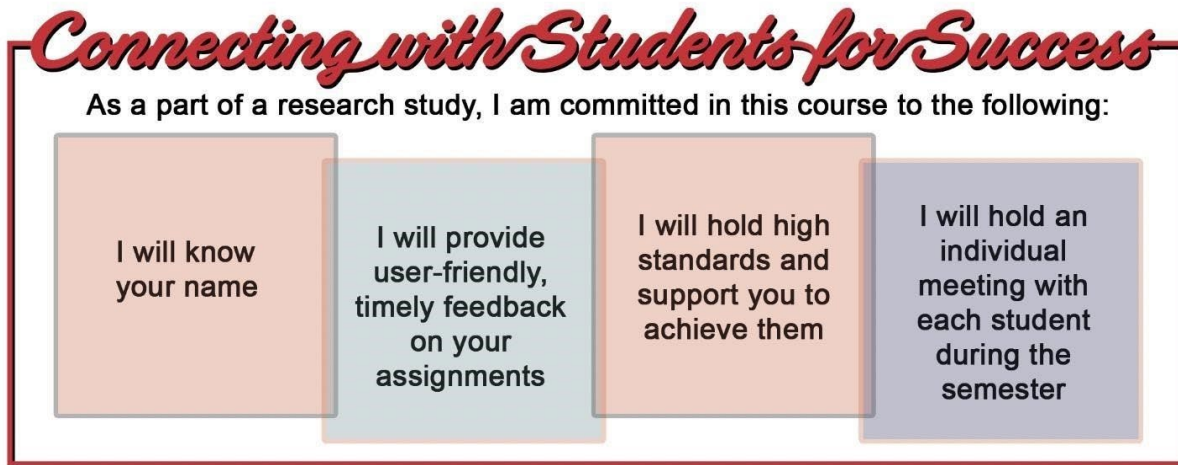

Course Description: This course offers mid-level linguistic structures of the Spanish language.
