**2. Course Overview**

- This course is designed for students with an interest in journalism and good writing skills who want practical experience in writing for publication.
- Over the course of the semester, students will serve as reporters and editors for the Skyline student newspaper. They will be required to report and write 4 stories for the newspaper and to edit two stories.
- Students are required to attend through Zoom the weekly meeting of Skyline staff.
- By the end of this course, you will be a functional reporter able to identify, research, and write a professional news story, and to edit the stories of other staff members.

**3. Course Primary Learning Objectives**

- By the conclusion of this course the student should be proficient in:
  - i. News Writing in AP style
  - ii. News Editing in AP style
  - iii. Editorial Writing
  - iv. Story selection
  - v. Interviewing
  - vi. Research and Investigation
  - vii. Promoting Skyline stories on social media
  - viii. Understanding the nuances of the law as it relates to media
  - ix. Understanding the critical role journalism plays in a democracy

**4. Student Learning Outcomes**

- The successful student will have developed the skills listed above.

**5. Course Requirements**

- Attend class or weekly Skyline staff meetings, which will often be in lieu of class as directed by the professor.
- Write four news stories for the Skyline student newspaper and edit two stories prepared by a staff member
- Attend through Zoom weekly Skyline staff meetings

## **6. Criteria for Grade Evaluation**

- Each student will be graded on the basis of adherence to the assignment's guidelines in an effective, timely and comprehensive way. Effort and improvement over the course of the term are the two most important criteria for grading.
- Evaluation of performance in this class is largely subjective, and as such this aspect of the class will be solely at the professor's discretion.
