Statement of Purpose: The mission of the Educational Leadership Program is to prepare students for the principalship by assisting them in mastering the TExES Principal Domains and Competencies so that these principal candidates succeed in creating exemplary 21st Century schools. The Educational Leadership Program serves a diverse population and celebrates that diversity by emphasizing a multi-cultural approach to teaching and learning that strives to address all students' needs. Classes employ diverse teaching strategies such as virtual classroom, discussion board, in-field application, and group work. In this way, the Educational Leadership Program addresses the learning styles of all students. In addition, the curriculum embraces best practices for selection of textbook and research curricula materials. These curricula materials are routinely reviewed in light of assessment results to ensure the program continuously improves and remains aligned to its objectives which are determined by the State of Texas – the TExES Principal Standards/Competencies. These standards/competencies changed in 2016, and the Program has just finished its curricula re-alignment work and is in the process of implementing new curricula to align to the new TExES Principal Standards/Competencies. The curricula is implemented in three steps. In step one, introductory courses provide an overview of the research tools and TExES competencies which are the basis for the student learning outcomes in the program. These introductory courses provide an overview of the subjects and competencies to be covered in the remaining courses in the program. Thus, step one establishes a foundation for the entire program. Step two provides a deeper and more focused study of the TExES Principal Competencies, which are the basis for the student learning outcomes, so that students develop a mastery of the content material associated with them. The third step consists of field experience and implementation of three authentic, capstone projects completed in the core courses, which are designed to assist the students in improving their school campus while also teaching them mastery of the competencies through their application to a real-world setting. Students will also complete a comprehensive portfolio as a summative assessment of the program and will demonstrate mastery of the competencies in a presentation of the portfolio or comprehensive exam before a panel of Educational Leadership Faculty.

Graduates of the MED program will demonstrate a commitment to the SRSU Mission of high quality teaching, research, cultural awareness, creativity, and service through their own careers in education.

Evidence of Improvement from Previous Assessment Cycle: During the 2018 SACSCOC Accreditation process, SRSU was directed to review the thirteen different degree plans for the same subjects that are offered at our campuses and combine each of the thirteen into one for the entire university. Therefore, the MED Educational Leadership at the off-site campuses and the MED Educational Leadership offered in Alpine were merged.
