I am definitely going to miss Sul Ross. I very much enjoyed the small classes and being able to really connect and know my professors.

I have enjoyed my experience here, thank you Sul Ross State.

My time at Sul Ross has been one I would not repeat if given the chance. In fact, I would say I'm disappointed I wasted two years of my life here if it weren't for the few people I met that I now count as friends and future colleagues. I felt that I was tricked into coming to Sul Ross with the promise of a "one of a kind" digital art and computer science program with "state of the art computer labs" and courses. I had high hopes and the only thing that made the lack of learning and weak courses worth it were the professors in computer science and digital art. Not only did I take a full course load with 18 hours or more a semester, but I enrolled in inexpensive private classes online that had no professors or feedback, and I learned more from those classes in two weeks than I did at Sul Ross in two years. While my main professor is definitely a teacher at heart, he has his hands tied with what he can do, due to the lack of industry standard programs and computer issues, as well as the dean of the art department being insufferable half of the time. I know there are "budget constraints" but if you want good, positive recognition for a program, you need to make sure it's actually worth paying for. Not only are students limited in networking for programs like computer science and digital art due to Sul Ross' physical location, but they have the added limitations of programs and hardware that limit what quality of work they can produce. This is a complete disservice to the students that pay to come here to learn who most likely can't afford their own computer or hardware. They rely on Sul Ross and I feel that Sul Ross could care less. Additionally, more art professors are desperately needed. Just this semester several students learned that they would have to delay their graduation an entire semester due to a course in the summer not being available, and potentially another that won't be offered until next Fall. It's frustrating for the students and for the professors who have to juggle their classes. I feel that with at least one professor added to the digital art courses, the quality of the courses would boost tremendously, allowing both professors to effectively teach their courses, and allowing students and professors to work together to create independent study courses when necessary so as not to waste an entire semester in one class when that time could be spent actually in their career field. This being said, another issue is that there is basically no communication within the art department until something has gone wrong and the dean is upset with someone. It's like pulling teeth in any area of Sul Ross to get people to effectively communicate with anyone, especially administrative staff to students. I feel this needs to be addressed, as it hasn't improved at all in the two years I've been here, taking classes every semester, including summer I and II courses. I realise these comments were overwhelmingly negative, but the one thing Sul Ross has that I think would be hard to find anywhere else in Texas, are the people. Sul Ross doesn't seem like the university to come to in order to earn a large salary or network with the big businesses of the world. There are a few professors who seem genuine in their interest of teaching, and it's an irreplaceable experience to have been a name and not a number in courses. The individual attention that is available to students in computer science and digital art is something I think Sul Ross excels in due to the smaller class sizes. Without the distractions and hustle and bustle of large cities to distract students, it's a much more relaxing and peaceful atmosphere that I've yet to find at any other university I've visited. To summarize, I think at least one more digital art professor, better programs and updated technology, and better communication are vital to the success of this program. I hope that in the future the digital art program can evolve into something better, something worth paying for, and something that students won't say "I regret ever coming here" about. It's possible, but the way things are looking at the unviersity now, I don't think it will happen any time soon.
