Peer Coaching

Pair students based on reading ability
Train the stronger reader to provide proper

Progress Monitor

feedback

Repetition is key

Repeated Reading

- Teacher-led at student's instructional reading level
- Provide feedback on errors and growth (fluency and accuracy rate)
- Listening Passage Preview is also beneficial when paired with repeated reading

Modeling

Modeling fluency through shared reading can come from a parent or guardian, teacher, pre-recorded text, or higher-level peer.

Improve a student's prosody with exposure to expressive reading, which includes reading with proper intonations and phrasing throughout a passage (Wendling & Mathers, 2009).
