DR. ALICIA M. TROTMAN

Dr. Alicia M. Trotman is an Assistant Professor in Psychology whose Caribbean heritage hails from Trinidad and Tobago. She has an academic background in Computer Science and Applied Psychology from Pace University in New York, and earned her doctorate in Learning, Technology and Culture at Michigan State University. Her divine calling has always included teaching and working with students, which began in 1996. She came to Sul Ross State University in 2017 and has continued to work diligently with her instruction having been awarded SRSU Outstanding Teacher of the Year 2021-2022. Her favorite classes to teach are Emotions & Motivation, Psychology of Religion and Spirituality, and Humanistic Psychology, and she advises the students' Psychology Club and Anime Manga Club.

She is dynamically involved in creating professional development opportunities in mental health for students. She conducts research in emotions using humanistic, spiritual, and person-centered methodologies, gradually building a dynamic digital presence at her university with PRISM (Promotores de la Salud Mental Restauradora y Integrativa / Promoting Restorative and Integrative Mental Health). She and her colleague, Dr. Tiffany Culver, were awarded a CEMRRAT (Commission on Ethnic Minority Recruitment, Retention and Training) Grants from the American Psychological Association to ensure that students obtain stipends as they develop PRISM.

Furthermore, she is collaborating with a non-profit organization in México that specializes in grief counseling and death culture to humanize and heal the processes that accompany death and dying. Essentially, her hope is to help transform the experience of loss that many people experience at different points of life from regret/resentment/repression towards passion/ideation and resolve.

She is an active member of APA Division 1 (Society for General Psychology) and was the Program Co-Chair for the Division's program "Bridging the Gap: Integrating Diverse Perspectives in Psychological Science" in 2021-22 for the APA Convention held in Minneapolis, MN. She is also an active member of the Association for Women in Psychology (AWP) producing the newsletter from 2019-23. Within her professional expertise, she collaborates with members of the Committee on Online and Distance Education, Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, Faculty Learning and Teaching Center, and the Library and Technologies and Research Council respectively to improve processes and structures to enable student access and success. She is also affiliated with the Committees of the Student Research Symposium and Big Bend Comic Con (BBCC), and BBCC last hosted their Comic Con in Alpine, TX in 2021. Besides teaching, conducting research, and committing to service, she is a loyal enthusiast of tea, yoga, aerobics, soca, electronic dance music, movies, and anime.



DR. TIFFANY CULVER

Dr. Tiffany Culver's professional career began with a Bachelor's in Psychology at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, New Mexico. She then continued her education at Mississippi State University and earned her Master's and Ph.D. in Educational Psychology. Dr. Culver has contributed to her field with several published peerreviewed scholarly articles in the Journal of College Reading and Learning, College Teaching, and Delta Educational Journal. Currently, she has over 63 research presentations. A far cry from her original undergraduate major in Chemical Engineering.

Dr. Culver is an Educational Psychologist with teaching experience at both public and private institutions/universities. She currently holds the rank of Assistant Professor of Psychology at Schreiner University in Kerrville, Texas. Prior to this, Dr. Culver taught as an Associate Professor at Sul Ross State University – Rio Grande College in Uvalde, Texas. At SRSU, the student body repeatably/proudly recognized her as a "Faculty Favorite." Dr. Culver accepted this heart-felt award from them in 2011-2012, 2017-2018 and 2019-2020. Her career is driven by a personal interest in seeing students progress and achieve. Reading compliance, metacognitive readings strategies, and reading comprehension in college students are her primary concerns. Recently, her focus has evolved to study the mental health of college students as mental well-being is a growing national concern.

The American Psychological Association recently awarded her and her colleague, Dr. Alicia Trotman a CEMRRAT (Commission on Ethnic Minority Recruitment, Retention and Training) grant from the American Psychological Association to create opportunities for their Psychology students to access mental health resources and simultaneously benefit from unique opportunities to develop their own clinical experience. Besides her professional and class-based activities, she is the advisor for the Psychology Club and employs three Psychology Coordinators. Under her direction, Psychology students are allotted the experience of at least four community speakers/tours per semester. She encourages students to assist in community organizations involved in mental health, such as the American Foundation of Suicide Prevention (AFSP), Uvalde Bereavement Center Grief Camp, and Kerrville Volunteer Service Council.

Culver is a board member and Secretary/Regional Liaison for the South Texas chapter of the American Foundation of Suicide Prevention. She also serves on the Volunteer Service Council of Kerrville State Hospital, Kiwanis of Kerrville (board) and the National Alliance on Mental Illness. In addition, Dr. Culver has coordinated mental health programs at Schreiner University for students, faculty and staff. She has also developed the New Faculty Mentoring Program at Schreiner University.

On a personal note, Dr. Culver is a very proud mother of her son, Myles Culver. He is currently enrolled as a police cadet the Law Enforcement Academy of Southwest Texas Junior College and resides in Uvalde, Texas with his lovely wife, Anna.
