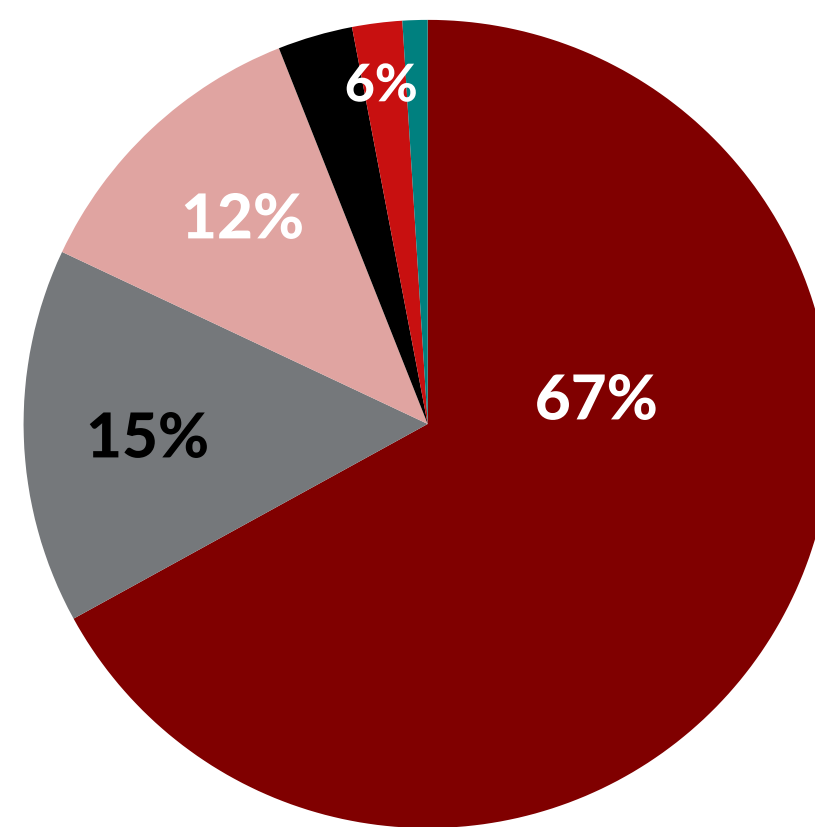
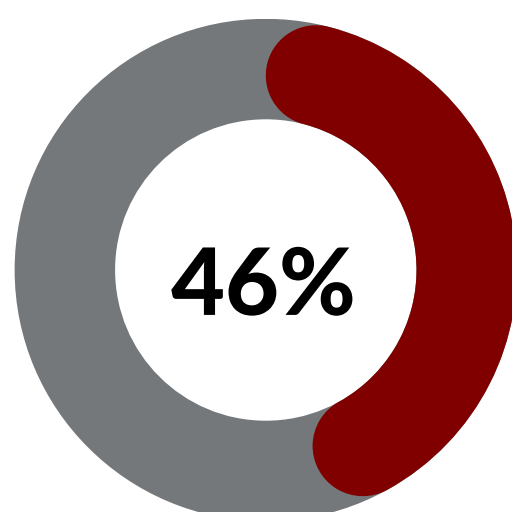
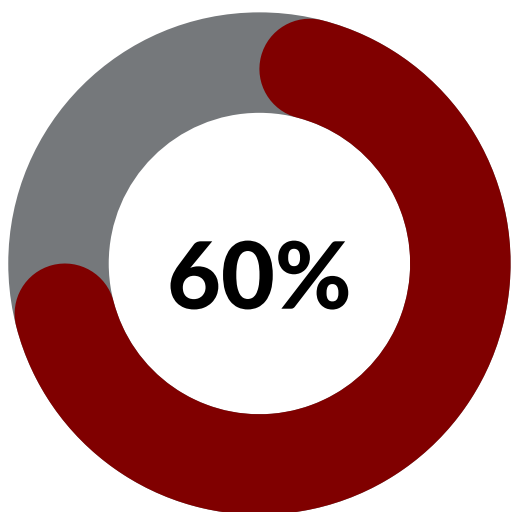
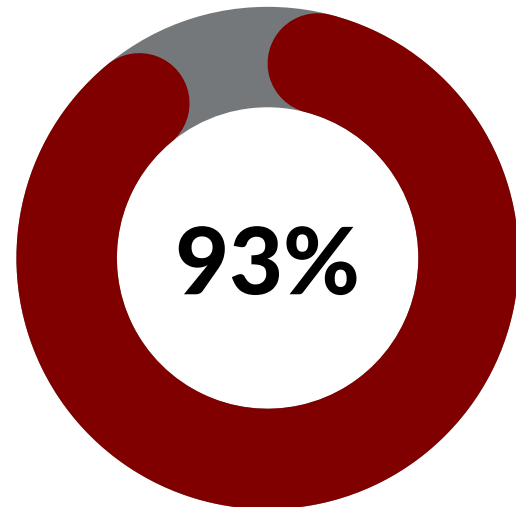
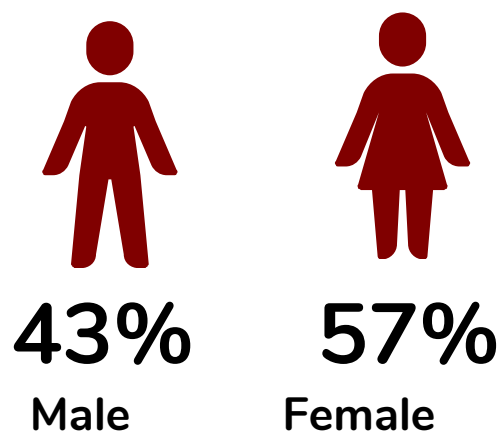
About the Lobo Pantry

The Lobo Pantry is a temporary, judgement free resource for students experiencing food insecurity and/or financial difficulty. Students are eligible to visit the pantry once per month. Additional outreach services are open to students, faculty, and staff; however, data in this report reflects the unique student engagement with the Lobo Pantry.

The Lobo Pantry is located in Ferguson 108 and is managed by the Office of Civic Engagement & Student Assistance.

151 students live On-Campus

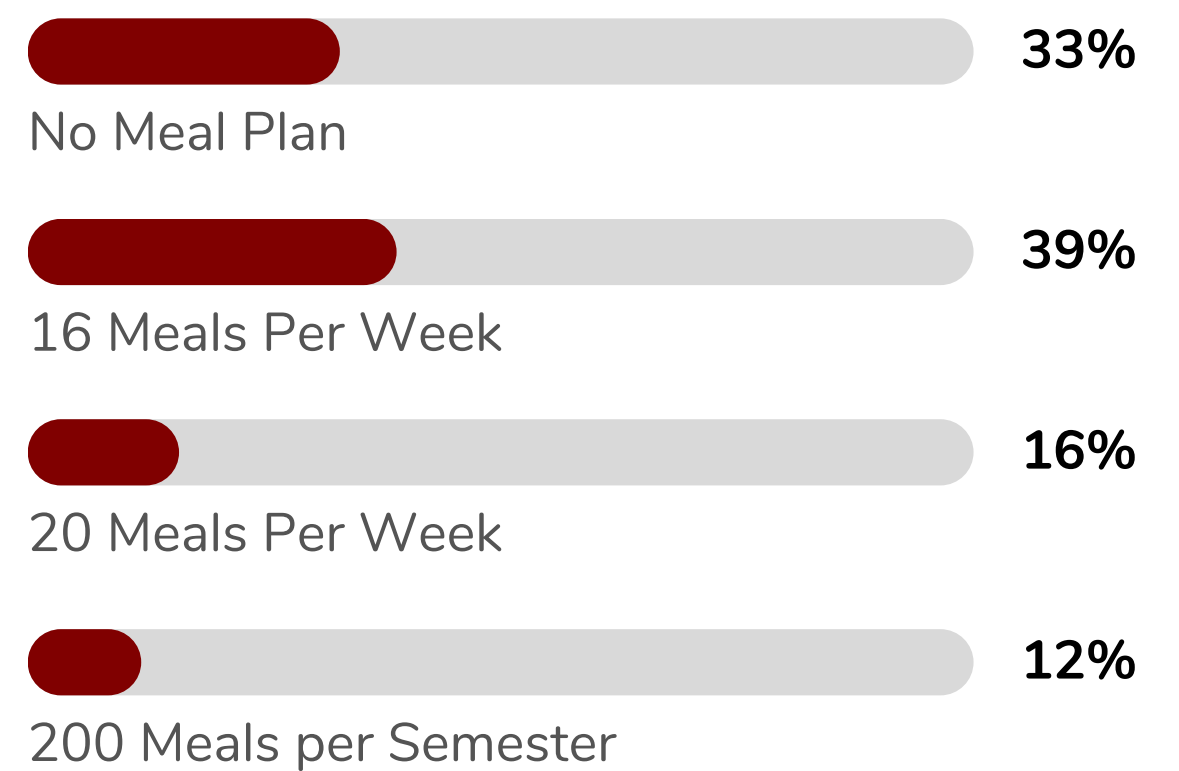

67% of students are on a meal plan

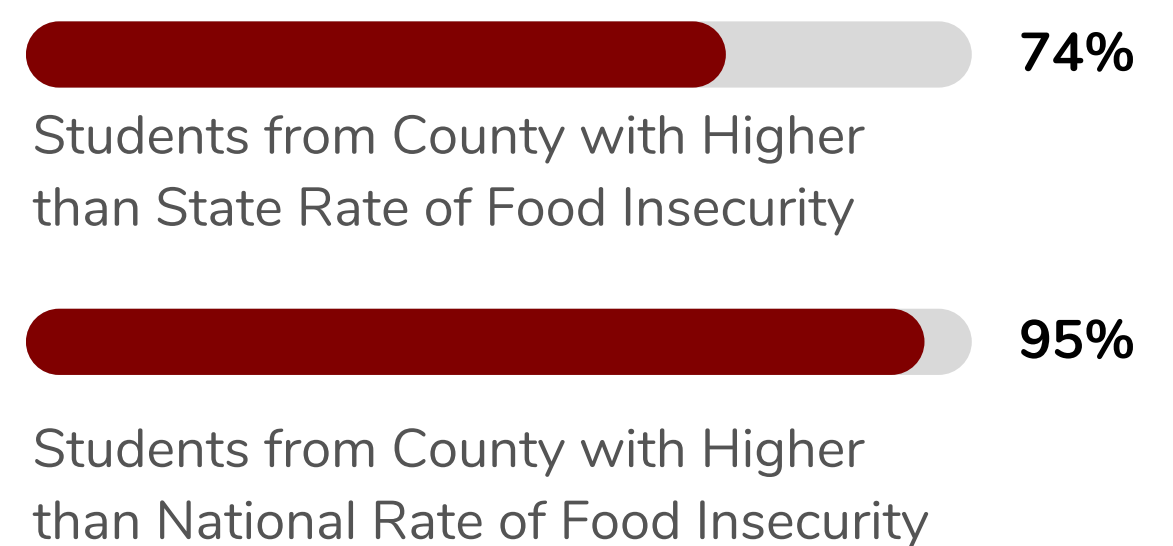
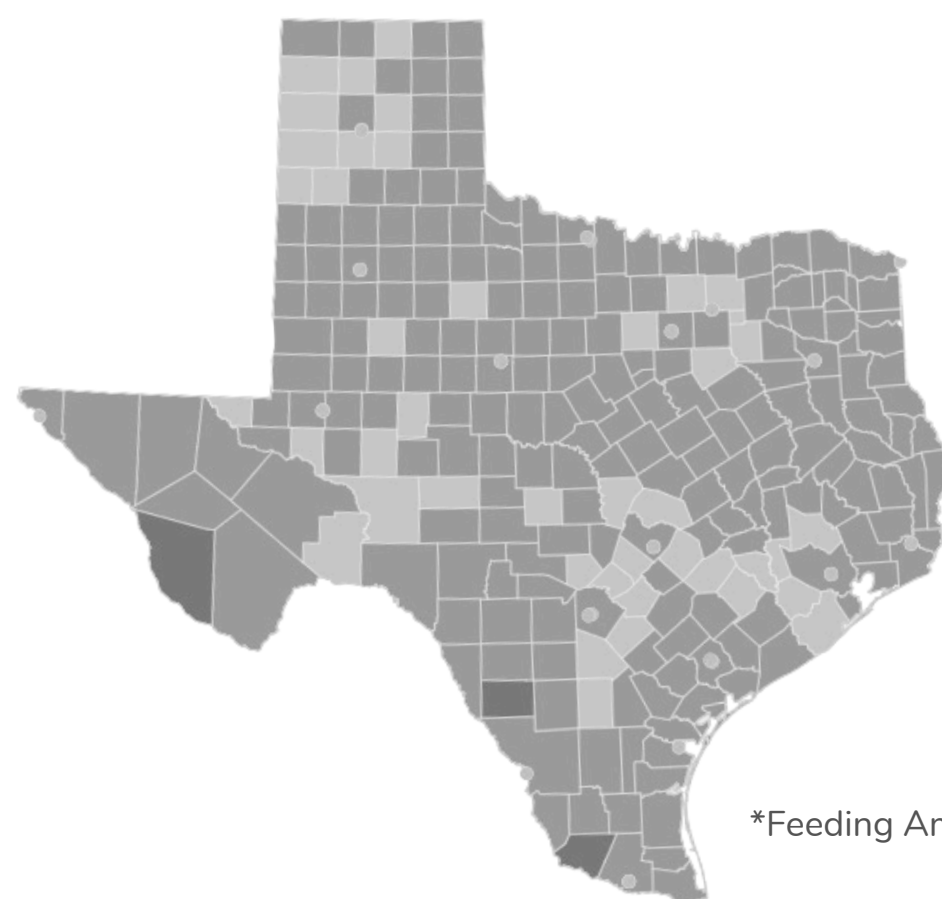
Students living in Lobo 1 and Lobo 2 housing (non-apartments) are required to be on a campus meal plan. All other students can choose to opt out of meal plans.



Food Insecurity

Texas Food Insecurity = 13.7 %
US Food Insecurity = 10.4

Data were collected to assess a students historical relationship with food insecurity based on the county of their hometown. Brewster county has a 14.3% food insecurity rate. Approximately 45% of Lobo Pantry users come from counties experiences higher food insecurity rates than Brewster County.
