- President forwarded two other policies for review and edits that are due November 20.

Web Page Listing Surplus Items-

- Dr. Warnock proposed a website listing surplus items
- Focusing on getting spaces that are usable.
- In 2019, used Facebook to advertise items that they weren't using. 75% of the sale value went back to unit and 25% stayed at the university surplus fund.
- Proposes that she speak to Chuy and Vince: Can we put pictures of things on Facebook?
- Set up SRSU surplus webpage. At the beginning post pictures of sale items, close the bids at the middle of the month and collect payments at the end of month.

- Dr. Igo suggested that we give some items to school districts, ex. braising rod for welding.
- Is there a requirement for notice? Dr. Warnock said they can get an auctioneer or an arm's length site that shows items for sale. This proves that we posted items for a fair chance to purchase.
- Bonnie Albright does not have problem with this, as long as it follows policy.
- Would be a bid online-person would email their bid to the specific email address. Link to surplus policy.
- President's recommendation-there are companies that do this for a small commission-We should look into this. We don't have manpower to keep up with website.
- Keeping track of sources to execute source of funds back.
- Received more buy in from departments because they are receiving money for their departments.
- Bonnie Albright will check on companies that can do this with an auctioneer.
- Are we limited to the number of surplus sales we can have? Not aware of it.

- In Banner, when an academic program wants to order something, then will the items still go through the approval process in Banner still? Laura asked-Bonnie said if it doesn't pass budget, then the requisition will get stopped there.
- If something get stopped at Budget, they will communicate the probelm to the requesting department.
- As we build SaaS, then we will rebuild the hierarchy.
- When recruiting, we should have department, vice president and eventually President's office approval. You should not need to go back unless you are requesting more money for the individual.
- With new model-an accurate budget is very important. New consultant started this week. Retired and has agreed to work with us for the next 3 to 4 months. He will train our personnel on the budget. He will train the hierarchy of banner.
- He will worknext to be sure the positions are being paid from the correct fund to give us an clean start for the new year.
- Once positions are correct in budget, then we can figure out what academies need.

- Fund-relatively clean, Org is a mess. We need to change what the org number reports to, not the actual org number. If we change the org number, then we lose the history of the org number.
